# PREVENTATIVE CARE MEDICATIONS

Certain medications to help prevent disease may be available for you at \$0 cost-share based on the new health care reform requirements per the PPACA (Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act).

## What medications qualify\*?

Medications or certain categories of drugs that qualify have a rating of A or B in the current U.S. Preventative Services Task Force recommendations. These categories include:

Aspirin products for:	Folic acid supplements (0.4mg to 0.8mg) for:
Men: Age 45-79 years	Women planning or capable of pregnancy
Women: Age 55-79 years	
Iron supplements for:	Oral fluoride supplementation for:
Children ages 6-12 months	Children 6 months-6 years

### Breast cancer preventative medications for:

Women at high risk for breast cancer and low risk for adverse medication effects To qualify for a \$0 copay for up to 5 years:

- Your prescriber must submit for approval via prior authorization (PA) if used for <u>primary</u>

- You must be age 35 years and older without a prior history of breast cancer
- You must be at increased risk of breast cancer after risk assessment and counseling with your prescriber
- Only generic raloxifene and tamoxifen are eligible

### Hormonal Contraceptives: available to women

As specified by health care reform, women must have access to a full range of FDA-approved contraceptive methods. However, plans can use *reasonable medical management* to decide what birth control products are available at \$0 cost-share. For most plans coverage is as follows:

- All generic contraceptives listed on your drug formulary are available for you at \$0 cost-share
- Branded contraceptive agents listed on the formulary may require you to fail or have tried a generic contraceptive before obtaining at \$0 cost-share
- Coverage may vary according to your plan. Please refer to applicable plan documents.

#### How do I obtain a qualifying medication at \$0 cost share?

- Must be filled at a network pharmacy with a prescription
- Must be prescribed by a health care professional
- Must be age, gender, or condition appropriate
- Must have prior authorization approval, when applicable
