<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Cardiovascular Disease Testing: We cover one noninvasive screening test for men (over 45) and women (over 55) who are diabetic or have a risk of developing coronary heart disease, based on a score derived from the Framingham Health Study coronary prediction algorithm, that Is Intermediate or higher. We cover up to \$200 for one of the following noninvasive screening tests for atherosclerosis and abnormal artery structure and function every five years: computed tomography (CT) scanning (measuring coronary artery calcification) or an ultrasonography (measuring carotid Intima-media thickness and plaque). This test Is subject to the applicable deductible and coinsurance.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup>The US Preventive Services Task Force recommends screening for colorectal cancer starting at age 50 years and continuing until age 75 years by one of the following methods: Colonoscopy every 10 years, Fecal occult blood test every year, or FIT test every year.
