### **Member COVID-19 Vaccine Key Messages**

Members should check the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) website and social media accounts for the most current information, as information is subject to change.

#### Do your research to check your eligibility and find a vaccine provider.

- Be patient. Vaccine supply is limited, but Texas receives more vaccines every week.
- Phase 1A and Phase 1B individuals can get the vaccine right now. This includes:
  - Healthcare staff.
  - o Texans 65 years of age and older.
  - People 16 years of age and older with at least one chronic medical condition that puts them at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19, such as but not limited to:
    - Cancer
    - Chronic kidney disease
    - COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
    - Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease or cardiomyopathies
    - Type 2 diabetes mellitus

- Solid organ transplantation
- Obesity and severe obesity (body mass index of 30 kg/m2 or higher)
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- If you are in Phase 1 and eligible to receive the vaccine, please check the <a href="COVID-19">COVID-19</a> Vaccination Hub Providers page to find a hub near you and learn how to register.
- Alternately, you can also check the websites of vaccine providers listed on the <u>Texas COVID-19 Vaccine Availability map</u> to see if they have enough vaccine supply at this time.
- Remember:
  - o Do not show up at a hospital or clinic looking for vaccine.
  - o Instead, please check their website for information about vaccine availability.
  - o Call only if the website doesn't answer your questions.

#### COVID-19 vaccines are being distributed as they become available.

- The Texas Commissioner of Health appointed an <a href="Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel"><u>Expert Vaccine Allocation Panel</u></a> to make recommendations on vaccine allocation decisions.
- This panel identifies groups that should be vaccinated first with the goal of providing protection to vulnerable populations and critical state resources.

## **Member COVID-19 Vaccine Key Messages**

• Other groups will receive vaccines in coming months as more vaccines are made available.

### Safety remains a top priority.

- COVID-19 vaccines have been evaluated in tens of thousands of volunteers during clinical trials and are only authorized for use if they are found to be safe.
- Even though no safety issues were found, the CDC and other federal partners will continue to monitor the COVID-19 vaccines.
- The US vaccine safety system is already strong, and new safety systems have been added for COVID-19 vaccines.

### Getting "back to normal" will take all our tools.

- Get vaccinated when you become eligible.
- Wear a mask.
- Stay 6 feet away from others and avoid crowds.
- Wash your hands often.
